

## **Plastic Free July events continue**

On Friday 5 July there is a workshop on reusable menstrual products at Waiheke Sustainability Centre. Hosted by Kristin Busher, the workshop covers menstrual cups and reusable pads, how they can save you money and prevent waste. The workshop takes place from 12.30pm to 1pm. Following the workshop, join in lunch at Kai Conscious Café. If you have excess or unwanted food you can donate it for community lunches at the Waiheke Sustainability Centre.

On Saturday 6 July, the Plastic Free Fiesta takes place at the Sustainability Centre. The party starts with the story of little blue penguin Taiao and his efforts to save the Hauraki Gulf in a Balinese-style puppet show called Taiao's Journey. The show runs from 4pm to 4.30pm and is followed by a puppet workshop with Kashmir Postel at 4.30pm. Also at 4.30pm is a Nude Food workshop with ideas for creating party food such as dips and crackers without plastic. From 5.30pm to 6pm there is shared kai including Kai Conscious soup, before a 6pm screening of New Zealand documentary Living the Change, which explores solutions to global crises through the stories of people pioneering sustainable change. Guest speaker nine-year-old Monty Bailey will talk about his crusade to remove plastic straws from ferries. Suggested donation for the fiesta is \$10 per family or person.



Waiheke's next Island Coaches Collective workshop takes place on Sunday 14 July from 1pm to 3.30pm.

In this workshop Louise Marra will explore how our purpose finds us and how we can open to our deeper purpose in life, rather than hunt it down. She works with archetypes and especially the healer and the creator archetype to help integrate what holds us back and create from our place of wholeness to bring our gifts into the world in a way that serves the evolution of the world.

She says participants should bring their journals, some colour pens or pencils and an openness to have an exploration of the future of you and how it might find you.
